BULLS-EYE RESPONSE

I. **PURPOSE:**

III. **RESPONSIBILITIES:**

A. SHIFT SUPERVISOR:

1. Activate "Bulls-eye" when these two criteria are met:
 - a. A felony occurred within the past five minutes.
 - b. Vehicle and/or suspect descriptions are available.
2. End "Bulls-eye" either when the suspects are apprehended or 10 to 15 minutes after the first flash information is broadcast, if the suspect is not apprehended.
3. Assign officers to assist at scene when "Bulls-eye" is ended.

B. TELECOMMUNICATOR:

1. Alert all police units that a felony has occurred at (name location) within the past 5 minutes and broadcast any flash information available concerning suspect or suspect vehicle.
2. Assign a primary response officer, usually the district officer, and a secondary response officer. The first of these two officers to reach the scene becomes the primary response officer.
3. Update flash description every three to four minutes.
4. Alert shift supervisor after 10 to 15 minutes has elapsed.

C. PRIMARY RESPONSE OFFICER:

1. Within 15 seconds the primary response officer confirms the suspect has left the scene and broadcasts flash description of suspect or suspect vehicle. The primary response officer must quickly determine if the secondary response officer is needed at the scene. If not needed, the primary response officer broadcasts that the secondary response officer is not needed. The primary response officer will continue the investigation at the scene.
