- Emotional & Physical Balance seminar on Wednesday, September 11, 2019 presented by Kathryn Landis was attended by many of our patrons.
- Savvy social security Workshop presented by Mr. Crowley was well attended.
- Adult Game Night is scheduled for the 2<sup>nd</sup> Thursday of every month.
- ACT Practice Test co-sponsored by Princeton Review on Saturday, September 21, 2019 was attended by 27 high school students from Upper Merion and neighboring townships.

- Knit Nite in September was attended by 14 knitters.
