WEEKLY BULLETIN

For the week ending on April 27, 2017

Upper Merion Police Officers responded to 516 calls for service including 28 automobile crashes, 10 Retail Thefts, 6 domestics, 7 disabled vehicles, 10 meet complainants and 52 alarms. Some notable incidents from the same are detailed below:

MALL AND VICINITY

CCCF

Bloomington's 660 West DeKalb Pike – occurred 4/21/17 at 1657 hours

A male (older, glasses, shaved head) made a purchase during which he continually looked at a piece of paper depicting social security numbers, zip codes, and addresses. When the male then returned to make another purchase, the sales associated and loss prevention officers determined the credit card was fraudulent.

Recovered Stolen Property

An unknown male returned a pair of shoes for cash. An employee later discovered a handgun magazine containing twelve 9 mm rounds in the box.
