## **EXECUTIVE SECRETARY'S REPORT:**

Mr. Hamaday mentioned requests for certifications have been received in the mail for the UVR development at the Villages of Valley Forge. This is the certification per the agreement that they will pay their tapping fee per the agreements in the amount of \$567,188.00.

#### **DIRECTOR OF PUBLIC WORKS REPORT:**

Mr. Hickman gave updates in regards to the Trout Run Emergency Generator Project, the contractor has mobilized. Some deliveries have been received but the main issue will be the delivery of the generator which is still projected for mid-August. Over the next few weeks, the site work will be completed. Another project is the Flash Mixer that will be installed at Trout Run. A pre-bid meeting was held with six to seven firms in attendance and it will close at the end of the month. The matter is projected to be brought to the Authority at the August meeting. The SCADA project is also ongoing and 90% of the design is under review with Upper Merion Staff with some comments regarding the wiring diagrams. Those comments will be incorporated into the Final Design documents. Mr. Hickman mentioned that the Township has a paint and coating project that is ongoing and will be covering elements for Trout Run and Matsunk.

# **FINANCIAL REPORT:**

Regarding the revenue, there was \$29,144 collected in revenue and represents fees paid for 4 new single-family dwellings. Also, the Township paid the Authority the first installment fee of \$480,000. Interest earned was \$12,115.97 and includes 4 cd's maturing. Regarding expenses, they are reflective of the requisitions that the Authority approved last month.

# **STORMWATER**

Mr. Hickman stated, this is the last Sanitary and Stormwater meeting before the next presentation that Gannett Fleming is going to provide the Authority. Mr. Hickman highlighted some of the stormwater fee costs. A spreadsheet was created that originally listed the current service costs and that totaled around \$760,000.00. A revision has been made that include recommendations for the future level of service and that totaled \$1.38 million. The main reason for that jump in costs is the incorporation of more money for capital projects for stormwater. Mr. Hickman also gave a brief rundown of what the MS4 program consists of. The MS4 program follows a pollution reduction plan and as part of that plan, several different areas have been identified where the Township is trying to reduce the pollution that makes its way in the watershed. What was targeted in this current permit were stormwater basin retrofits which make some of the existing stormwater infrastructures throughout the Township perform better. There is a list of 16 basins that have been identified and none of those are Township owned. The ones that are Township owned are in fairly decent shape and do not require any retrofit. A discussion ensued regarding the responsibility of basin maintenance.
