WEEKLY BULLETIN

For the week ending on February 16, 2017

Upper Merion Police Officers responded to 546 calls for service including 19 automobile crashes, 11 Retail Thefts, 9 domestics, 8 disabled vehicles, 9 meet complainants and 57 alarms. Some notable incidents from the same are detailed below:

MALL AND VICINITY

Disturbance

King of Prussia Plaza 160 North Gulph Road – occurred 2/15/17 at 1403 hours

A mall employee parked her car in an area of the lot which had been coned off by mall security. She was advised that if her car was not removed it would be towed. After her car was towed, she went to the security office to complain, then went outside and used a metal sign to smash the windshield on a security vehicle. The female will be charged with criminal mischief.
