#### Board Comment:

Mr. Bartlett stated that PSATS, the Pennsylvania State Association of Township Supervisors is a meeting in Hershey, Pennsylvania consisting of supervisors from all over the state.

Mr. McBride recalled the discussion last year about reducing the number of attendee delegates at this convention and moved to send a single supervisor and the township manager.

Mr. Bartlett outlined some of the beneficial aspects of the PSATS convention and believed that more supervisors should attend.

Mr. Jenaway pointed out that he has been a speaker at this convention for four of the last five years and he will be speaking again this year at no cost to the township.

Mrs. Spott commented that cost issue aside, during a time when residents and township employees have been asked to help during these difficult times that this is the year where supervisors attendance [at the PSATS convention] should be limited.

Mr. McBride amended and clarified his motion and said that he agrees with Chairman Bartlett that it is a valuable conference to attend and he also agrees with Mrs. Spott that for one year the Board could forego sending everyone and just send two supervisors [one of whom is voting delegate] and the township manager – total of three people. He noted that Mr. Jenaway would already be there at no cost to the township.
