CHURCH RD BRIDGE REPLACEMENT PROJECT – SUPPLEMENTAL ENGINEERING AGREEMENT WITH PENNDOT

RESOLUTION 2020-05 AUTHORIZING CHAIRPERSON TO EXECUTE AND AUTHORITY ENGINEER TO ATTEST A SUPPLEMENTAL REIMBURSEMENT AGREEMENT WITH PENNDOT

Authority Action:

EXECUTIVE SECRETARY'S REPORT

Mr. Hamaday gave updates regarding developments with potential impact fees. Approval was given for a warehouse on 900 River Road and that will be a transportation impact fee of over \$200,000.00. One of the requirements will be a post traffic impact study. In addition, there will also be a traffic impact fee for a plan that will very likely be approved next week for construction of a 5-story Best Western Hotel. There will ordinances to change the zoning for the shopping center where Hobby Lobby is located to shopping center. This will allow for the shopping center to be further developed.

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ENGINEER'S REPORT

Relocated North Gulph Road, SR 0023 Section 2NG

(Including Granite Block Restoration at Valley Forge Monument)

Mr. Smyth stated a virtual progress meeting is being scheduled for August 20, 2020. The environmental clearance and re-evaluation are being finished up in this upcoming period. There is concentration on the culvert and sizing of it. In regards to the Granit Block Restoration, the Utility Clearance request is being prepared. A response was received from the three utility companies and so the Utility Clearance is in the process of being finalized. For this project a temporary construction easement would be needed and that is being done through a special use permit from Valley Forge National Park. It has been submitted to the National Park and is under review. The project is in Final Design. The Traffic Control Plan reviews have been received from PennDOT. There is also a Plans and Presentation Review that is a major step in Final Design which was submitted back in the end of June. A Constructability Review will be received from PennDOT and then it will go into Contract Management.

Church Road Bridge over SEPTA Route 100 Line

Mr. Smyth stated this project has gone out to bid through PennDOT. To the contractors it was made available on July 22, 2020. Bids will be open on September 3, 2020. During this period of six weeks, contractors are allowed to ask questions. Two questions were received and required two addendums that have been posted as of today. The next step is going through execution of documents and that will all be done through the Authority.

Prince Frederick Extension (PFE)

Mr. Smyth noted that the Prince Frederick developer is getting the rapid flashing beacon permit from PennDOT for the trail crossing.

Potential New PA Turnpike Interchange at Henderson Road

Mr. Smyth noted continued coordination with DVRCP, they are in the process of finalizing the reports on the study.

SOLICITOR'S REPORT- none.

PUBLIC WORKS REPORT

Mr. Hickman reported that South Gulph Road is closed and it is a PennDOT issue. They are repairing some of the roadway that was damaged during the tropical storm that hit. They are approximately two weeks away from reopening that stretch that is in between Upper Gulph Road and Arden Road and that is where those detours will remain until it returns.

FINANCIAL REPORT

Mr. Hiriak reported changes to investments noting that for the foreseeable future it will probably remain at the low levels that they are. The Township Auditors did complete the audit, once a PDF copy is received, it will be forwarded to the Authority.
