  - a. Recumbant bike on agenda

## 5. Staff Report

- a. Lower level renovation Last week's chairman meeting approved moving forward with 3-room renovations.
- i. Laminate wood floor and sound system in mind-body and standard floor/paint in other two rooms with leftover carpet.
  - ii. 2 bids coming in ceilings and the rest.
  - iii. Alternative bid to turn sprinkler heads down and put in drop ceilings.
- iv. Can use the rooms when finished for "pop up" programs with short term enrollment.
  - v. Will put a swipe door access.
- vi. Will lose significantly less on random non-passholder access than on FT employee downstairs. (There are cameras, too.)
- b. After school care program will start fall 2018. It will be announced this fall, and open enrollment in January 2018.
- c. ADC 2 Will be at the community center. Starts 7/31, full day and it is full with a long waitlist.
  - i. 100 campers each week.
  - ii. Space is being allocated and logistics (pick up/drop off) planned.
  - iii. One of the spaces downstairs will be used.
- iv. Pick up/drop off will be in the back of the building and that is where buses for trips will be.
- v. One classroom, a court, the art room, some outdoor spaces an open field behind the building.

- vi. Using the pool grass area before the pool opens.
- vii. Staff orientation next week to acclimate the counselors to the space and flow. A lot of ½ day trips.
  - viii. Next year can assess increasing capacity.
- d. Part time staff access to amenities Was presented as a show of appreciation for service, but the board is not comfortable with only giving a segment of the township employee workforce.
- i. 2 passes will be given to all citizen board members, pension-eligible first responders/EMT/Fire.
  - ii. They were open to planning employee appreciation days next year.
- iii. The only perk for township employees/citizen board members are discounts on township programs/amenities.
  - iv. Hiring starts in January.
- e. Vending machines in pool area they are gone
- f. Sign –is on the BOS agenda
- g. Parking update- designated and handicapped.
  - i. Handicapped has been approved. It will be done in-house.
  - ii. Designated spots Still waiting on formal BOS approval
- h. Pool/CC membership Revenue surpassed projections
  - i. 2289 passholders; 1069 new this year.
  - ii. 2131 pool members.
  - iii. 225 silver sneakers; 43 silver and fit.
- i. Budget Guidelines are in.
  - i. By beginning of September will have meeting with Dave Kraynik
  - ii. Proposal will be prepared toward end of September.
  - iii. Mid-October will be going to BOS.
  - iv. November will be drafted for public.
  - v. 1<sup>st</sup> week in December will be approved.
  - vi. Need a gator (utility vehicle) and lift, but not much else needed.
- vii. Spending has been curtailed and is being reviewed. All proposed expenses will be sent to the board for approval.
- j. Getting requests for additional recumbant bike. Thursday night, will be able to lease another bike. Will have 3.
- k. MCGOPA art exhibit
  - i. C3Art Gallery, UM Art Annex, 431 Art Gallery are being suggested
  - ii. Construction starting week after ADC2.
- 1. Classes
  - i. Group X numbers are evaluated every quarter.
- ii. Hypnosis classes, unwind and paint classes, and date night programs are extremely popular.
  - iii. Content and energy consistent, changes in instructor has not impacted attendance
  - iv. Big challenge find things that members don't know they want yet.
- m. Have your complimentary fitness consultation there is always an additional person in fitness center.

- a. Board picture take at Anniversary event; all in attendance, will be hung in C3
- b. ECDC meeting Mutual availabilities are determining when monthly meeting is.
- c. FT employee for downstairs area was nixed, saving \$50K
- d. Senior Center has been allowing use of their space, including the computer lab.
- e. Extended hours not all board members have weighed in yet. Cost of doing so is about 30-35 hr, about 208/week x 52 weeks > 10,816/year.
  - f. Cleaning will take place over a couple of days the week of August 28<sup>th</sup> after ADC2 ends.
  - i. Classic flooring will do light sand and acrylic finish to minimize odor and accelerate re-operations.
    - ii. Windows.
    - iii. Tile cleaning is \$1500 each time. Instead bought machine for \$2300.
    - iv. Locker rooms have been done.
    - v. Trying to find a company to fix tears in insulation.
    - vi. Painting will do on an as available basis.
- g. Roof No bids yet. Just needs TLC. One spot not primed, so condensate pan overflow went through ceiling. Expect it to be patched up by anniversary event.

  - i. Gerry has contacted manufacturer.
  - ii. People are running into it.
  - iii. Perhaps vinyl reinforcement.
  - iv. Have to be careful not to void warranty.
- f. BCA Grant is being applied to purchase audio visual equipment.

- g. Purposeful Play system glitch was causing date and year input to mismatch among 4 age groups occurring simultaneously. Corrected, and will be addressed in training 8/2 and 8/3 in computer lab of senior center.
- h. Annual training for staff will be Dale Carnegie.
