## UMPD CAB Meeting Minutes 9 November 2010

The meeting started with the Pledge of Allegiance.

First item of business: Approval of the September 14 minutes. Motion made by Tom Halfpenny, seconded by Allen Pomerantz, unanimously approved

Issue: Prince Frederick Street, near Valley Forge Road, brought up by Allen Pomerantz. There is a double yellow line on the road and cars park on both sides, which leaves drivers driving down the middle of the road approaching the curve. What can be done so people aren't driving into the curve blind? Sgt. Zadroga will follow up with Traffic Safety Sgt. Andy Andreyko and report back to the CAB.

Mischief Night: CAB queried if there were any problems in the township on Mischief Night. Sgt. Zadroga reported that there were no known problems, and that for the past ten years, Halloween night has been more of a problem than Mischief Night.

Economic Crimes Update: Detective David Gershanick presented an update on activities in the Economic Crimes Division. There have traditionally been 2 detectives assigned to this unit; however, as the problems continue to grow with regards to identify theft, 2 more detectives have been added. Two of the detectives will be on 8 hour shifts; two will be on 12 hour shifts. He recommends that everyone do a free credit report annually and to be aware of potential scams where contractors are looking for money, receiving emails where people ask you to send them money, etc. Any issues such as these should be reported to the UMPD.
