# Community Center Complex Advisory Board March 16, 2021 7:30pm

- 1. Attendance Sharon Davis, Karen Huller, Dennis Rudzinksi, Chris Levy, Ben Eyer, Paul Kubler, Greg Waks, Paul Salamy
- 2. Pledge of Allegiance
- 3. Approval of February 16th, 2021 minutes
  - a. Sharon moved; Chris seconded
  - b. All in favor
  - c. Approved
- 4. Staff Report
  - a. Passholder update: 1957
    - 1. Steady increase
  - b. Passholder cancellations 1066 since beginning of March
  - c. Passholder freezes 598
    - 1. Expect numbers to improve over time
  - d. Reopening update
    - 1. Daily average 156 during the week
    - 2. 108 on the weekends
    - 3. Moving in the right direction
  - e. Mask policies
    - 1. Mask needs to be worn correctly
    - 2. Intervention is sometimes necessary
      - 1. First warning
      - 2. Repeated offenders will be put on a record
      - 3. 2<sup>nd</sup> or 3<sup>rd</sup> offense they may be suspended for the day
      - 4. Further offenses are expelled
    - 3. How will vaccinations affect mask policies?
      - 1. CDC says everyone in the room has to have their vaccine to be maskless

- 2. It's too early to change the masking policy
- 3. Not much push back from passholders
  - a. Less than previously
- 4. Hard to prove who is vaccinated
- f. Summer Camps
  - 1. Getting info and registration info out Monday March 22
  - 2. Adventure Day Camp/Camp Beechtree
    - 1. Using the community center and the middle school
    - 2. Looking at Baxter Field for more risk averse families
    - 3. CDC and state health department has put out new guidelines
      - a. Smaller groups
      - b. Little intermingling
      - c. Also working with P&R organization
  - 3. Other weekly specialty camps
- g. BCA grant deadline is April 15<sup>th</sup>
  - 1. Deena suggested resurfacing the shuffle board/basketball courts at the pool
    - 1. Gary estimated \$3-4K to resurface it
    - 2. Dual purpose
    - 3. Pickleball or basketball
    - 4. Is it just putting more money into it when it will eventually change?
      - a. Will serve various players
      - b. Paul S believes it will get some use
  - 2. Arborvitae for privacy
    - 1. Paul talked to Tina; they did a walk through on the path
    - 2. They are discussing putting a solid white fence
      - a. Can add some to the chain link portion
      - b. Can still do a fundraiser to donate money for small plants that can grow larger
      - c. Park and Rec could also apply for BCA grant
      - d. Chris arborvitaes vs. fence
        - i. Aesthetics complimented by plants and be greener
        - ii. White fence would be PVC, low maintenance
        - iii. Fence or not, we could add plants
        - iv. Thinks by the senior center they could use more shrubbery, but it's not eye-level
        - v. There were discussions to add a connection from the senior service center to the pool
        - vi. Paul S. thinks there should always be a BCA submission
        - vii. Paul S. can complete the application for us.
        - viii. P&R is applying for informational displays
          - 1. \$600 each
          - 2. Will apply for 2-3
  - 3. Historical display for the gallery
    - 1. We haven't figured out where that would go, what it would look like, and what we need

- 4. 5<sup>th</sup> anniversary party
  - 1. P&R has been busy with camps
  - 2. In a few weeks they will start thinking more about it
  - 3. Nothing will be decided in time for the application due date
- 5. Chris asks Dennis what is his wish?
  - 1. Can't think of anything they want outside of what is in the budget
  - 2. Baseball would love a batting cage
    - a. Not sure there would be any good place
  - 3. Basketball backboard issues due to general use and how they are lowered and raise manually
    - a. If it were automated it would alleviate
    - b. Dennis thinks it might have been about \$10K
    - c. Dennis will see if there was a previous quote
    - d. Has been needing a repair crew to come in
- 6. Greg mentioned that there are fewer funds this year due to the Casino having been closed and not reopening at full capacity
  - 1. Thinks that the board should apply to stay top of mind
  - 2. May or may not get it
  - 3. He does not make recommendations as liaison
  - 4. Some board members do ask additional questions and that is an opportunity
- 7. Chris feels other organizations have larger needs
  - 1. Greg feels the board will be deferential to need-based organizations
  - 2. Paul S. what if other organizations think the same way
    - a. Greg It's possible some funds will be unused
    - b. Some organizations will get money because of what they do for the community
- 8. Are there grants available to get more efficient/green lighting?
  - 1. That type of application that is timely and topical and the BCA may look at it seriously
  - 2. Perhaps the C3AB could partner with the Environmental Advisory Board Zack Davis.
    - a. RF 100 Sierra Club commitment to make us as green a possible
    - b. Chris can we get the estimate in time?
    - c. CC: Carol Kenney as Supervisor Liaison to the EAC
    - d. Could be huge long-term savings to the center and tax payers
    - e. All C3AB members support this initiative
- 5. Board of Supervisors Liaison Report
  - a. Crow Creek Trail
    - 1. It's obvious that the contractor overcut and removed things that were not supposed to be removed
    - 2. Trying to find the opportunity in this
      - 1. Possibly extending the senior center patio
      - 2. Retaining wall may not be needed anymore

- 3. Could put a cut in with benches to overlook the trail when it gets reforested
  - a. Paul can imagine what the view will be like once trees are replanted and hopes the fished project will please residents
  - b. Shade Tree and Beautification Committee is involved
- 4. Touches various boards
- 3. Will be done in a few months, faster than expected
- 4. BOS is pushing contractor and project engineer to make good on this error
- 5. Paul S's idea to sponsor trees may have a good application here
- 6. Thinks the wildlife will return
  - 1. Wild turkeys spotted near the Towers
- b. Proposal at BOS zoning workshop meeting
  - 1. 2 Indoor hockey rinks, 2 soccer fields, 1 outdoor hockey rink
    - 1. Locker rooms/concierge
    - 2. Right near Steelyard sports, Renaissance Boulevard
      - a. On site of Shorty's junkyard
      - b. It will clean up an area and be used heavily
  - 2. Supervisors usually don't step into zoning, but they are unanimous in supporting this proposal
  - 3. If variance is granted, goes to land development for planning
  - 4. Will go on formal workshop or business agenda
  - 5. Local restaurants and hotels will benefit
  - 6. Sharon private or big business
    - 1. Private, it involves Shorty and Steelyard Sports
    - 2. He would provide a long-term lease and may have stake
  - 7. Building rinks are expensive to build and maintain
    - 1. Rink time is very expensive
  - 8. Sharon what kind of remediation?
    - 1. The rinks would not overlap, but yes significant remediation
  - 9. Timeline?
    - 1. Sooner rather than later
    - 2. Needs zoning changes
  - 10. Can they throw in roller skating rink?
    - 1. There's a rink in Bob White; it was on the slot to resurface this year
    - 2. Chris used to operate one and would love to open one in UM
    - 3. Sharon there are more activities available here that can happen than is talked about
      - a. Found out there was a park and tennis court in Executive Estates
      - b. Also courts in Whitegate
      - c. P&R does have a park map
      - d. Is there a schedule for social media where these little known features and amenities are promoted?
      - e. Greg suggests Paul and PIO can work on that
        - i. Some people don't want their park promoted
        - ii. They are township properties

- iii. The P&R board tours parks once a month and learns something new every time
- c. Historical Society potential display
  - 1. BOS is pleased that we think it's a good idea and they agree
  - 2. Next steps are to find space and objects
  - 3. There was an Historical Commission citizen board that formed last year
    - 1. Will partner with them
    - 2. Everything will be run through P&R
    - 3. Subcommittee?
      - a. Nominations Sharon, Paul K., Karen
      - b. Pat Jordan is the Chair
      - c. Greg will provide the contact information
      - d. Tina Smith, Dave Montalvo, Eileen Council, Sarah Ceipel
- 6. Park and Recreation Advisory Board Liaison Report
  - a. Some residents were unhappy with where the path was going and some of the trees that had to be removed
    - 1. Reparations are being made
    - 2. Township is making a good attempt to address some of the issues, which are valid
    - 3. 9-10 trees will be added and some will be relocated
  - b. Belmont school plans
    - 1. May be losing a softball field
    - 2. It is the school property, school plans
    - 3. The school redesign left out tennis courts
    - 4. Option was to put them at Belmont
    - 5. There's an issue with water run off or zoning needs a variance
    - 6. There were concerns about the design and losing the field
    - 7. There's a zoning hearing coming up this or next week and it's getting press
    - 8. Dennis P&R would no longer have access to use the property/field
      - 1. P&R is running very short of softball fields
      - 2. Only Bob White for adult softball
        - a. This limits teams
        - b. Chicinno field is possible
        - c. It pushes the need to move into Heuser phase 2, but COVID has impacted funding
- 7. Senior Center Representative Liaison Report
  - a. Dick McCann catch up
    - 1. Asked about reopening plans
    - 2. The seniors he's talked with are not anxious to return
    - 3. That may change in the coming months as more people get vaccinated
- 8. Student Liaison Report
  - a. Was asked about mental health opportunities for kids
    - 1. No one wants any more online offerings

- 2. When time allows, perhaps there could be a mental health activity with animals alpacas, other emotional support animals
- 3. Karen will ask Trinity about the farm that would visit
- b. Is there an opportunity for high school students to get together and do a community service project that benefits the center or community parks?
  - 1. Student Council people are big on earning grades for projects
  - 2. Thinks they would like to make as big of an event as is safe
- c. Ben goes to college in August Thinking Pitt not official
  - 1. When is his last meeting?
  - 2. Ben will think about someone who can take his place
  - 3. We probably found Ben through social media
    - 1. Citizen board vacancies are promoted by the board members
