MINUTES

Community Center Complex Advisory Board August 17th, 2021 7:30pm

- 1. Pledge of Allegiance.
- 2. Executive session was called.
- 3. Approval 6/15/21 & 7/20/21 minutes
 - a. Table 6/15 for approval next month. Changes have been made
 - b. Motion to approve 7/20 by Paul K/second by Paul S. Minutes approved
- 4. Staff Report.
 - a. Passholder update
 - A. Up to 1622 active members
 - B. Freezes are at 37 (annual)
 - C. Daily average visits179 per weekday; 100 weekend; up by 12 from last month
 - b. Child Watch Survey
 - A. Survey about concerns with memberships not being used due to no childcare
 - B. Email sent as well as on social media
 - C. 35 participants so far; will keep survey active and then discuss results at next meeting
 - c. Free Passholder Usage
 - A. 2 additional families joined; total of 5 families in the program
 - B. Not accepting any new free passholders; will hold any additional applications for now
 - C. Usage stats: 3 families started end of May; 1 family has visited 25 times, another 21 times an the 3rd family has used the center 10 times
 - D. All are on track with the usage stipulations of the program
 - d. Fall Programs

- A. Fall activity guide is available; expect to be back to normal for the Fall programs
- e. Pool Update pool memberships are well above what was projected
 - A. Follow-up to the question about capping the membership this is partially due to staffing issues and the ability to safely guard the pool
 - B. For next year, really need to think about how to hire and retain the lifeguard/pool staff with competitive salaries/benefits
 - C. Gino asked about the white chairs at the pool some are broken, some have mold. Paul S thinks the chairs were originally donated. Paul K suggested that maybe they can be replaced with a BCA grant
 - D. July 31 was International Lifeguard Day the Stingray swim team and the Hedgehog Grill threw a Thank-You Party for the lifeguards.
 - i. A suggestion to show off the pool, for next year, is to have an adult only Luau/party, have another Bingo night (first was more successful than the second this summer)
- 5. Board of Supervisors Liaison Report
 - a. Township solicitor Joe McGrory is retiring, will go through RFP process to find a replacement
 - b. There are more than 2 dozen BCA grant requests; to be awarded in September meeting
 - c. Shout -out to the people involved with the KOP Diner wishes them well
- 6. Park and Recreation Advisory Board Liaison Report
 - a. Irwin Moore house potential uses discussed. To be further discussed at Historical Commission meeting (which coincides with this meeting)
 - b. Heuser Park
 - A. Rosemont College is going to use the baseball fields, working with P&R, UMBA, School Districts
 - B. Will have ~4 games this Spring
 - C. Rosemont is open to UM running concessions but may not be realistic since the games are generally early afternoon and there may not be many people in attendance
 - c. Budget discussions for 2022 starting
 - d. Crow Creek Trail retaining walls being built for trail behind the pool; completion of whole trail should be by October.
 - e. Fall Fest Oct 2 at 3pm at Heuser. Fireworks at night, many concessions/tables signed up
 - f. Baxter Park lights need to be replaced; using BCA grant \$14,000
 - g. Heuser lights also need replacing on all the fields \$36000. A new BCA grant was filed on behalf of all the different sport teams. Paul K suggested that P&R talk with PECO to see if there are grant options or monies available to offset the cost.
 - h. Township P&R has resurfaced courts at Bob White, Swedeland Park, pickleball lines at Executive Estates
 - i. New trashcan project Paul S says they are "cool looking trash cans"
- 7. Senior Center Representative Liaison Report

- a. People are starting to come back slowly
- b. Encourage people to join the Garden Club the raised beds need care, they are overgrown
- c. Need to dig up and replant 2 large bushes
- d. Paul S suggested to ask HS Club/students to help, if possible, or liaise with the Shade Tree Commission (Paul S will contact)

8. Student Liaison Report

- a. No feedback about getting a replacement from the Leadership Camp
- b. Dennis will follow-up on if there is an age necessary to sit on a Board and if there are any ordinances, suggest maybe having an 8th grader and a HS student

9. Old Business

- a. 5th year Anniversary Celebration
 - A. Staff is overstretched right now and the Fall Fest is at Heuser Park
 - B. Dennis had a few ideas to highlight a 5th Anniversary promotion: T-shirts, free weekend for non-passholders
 - C. Paul S suggested mini-celebrations throughout the next year rather than one big celebration/Gino suggested asking if Frank Jones could help with give-aways
- b. Partnering with Historical Society
 - A. Paul K will reach out to them again to discuss putting up displays in the Community Center
- c. Paul S asked about the plans for the houses that abut the CC property
 - A. As far as we know, it is wait to see when/if the house is put up for sale
- d. Township COVID memorial
 - A. Greg said they BOS is considering how to create such a memorial

10. New Business

- a. Hometown Hero Banner Program
 - A. Paul S shared information about the potential for having flags for service members to be hung throughout Upper Merion
 - B. Bridgeport had a large number of applications
 - C. Paul has been looking around the township for available lampposts since we would expect a need for a lot of flags
 - D. Application for banners can be designated for any US service member
 - E. More information to come.
