- 1. Pledge of Allegiance
- 2. Attendance Paul Kubler, Chris Levy, Greg Waks, Rob DeFelice, Evelyn Ankers, Sudha Suryadevara, Karen Huller, Terry Stevens
- 3. Approval of January 16th minutes approved
- 4. Staff Report
 - a. Entrance Sign
 - i. Received new quote and new rendering
 - ii. \$20,989. \$22,500 was budgeted; \$19,488 was original
 - iii. Includes installation
 - iv. Timeline is forthcoming
 - b. BCA Grant
 - i. Heather is composing grant application for Red cross mannequins
 - 1. \$2107 for 8 adult, 8 infant manegunns and 2 AD trainers
 - ii. There will not be a joint application with the Senior Center
 - iii. 3 new people on BCA board.
 - 1. David Karan is sick
 - 2. Eric Pearson, new casino President, will replace Mike Bowman. Sat in last year, but had not participated
 - 3. Brett is replacing another member Scott Milner family is relocating to Paris
 - 4. Lydia Sardinas the only person still there who has reviewed the applications before
 - iv. Casino never filled their 2nd spot
 - c. Lower Level Renovation
 - i. Nearly complete
 - ii. Items of note

- 1. Locks on doors Swipers are battery operated. Working with IT to figure out a solution
- 2. Floor in the mind/body room color is varied in one area; contractors will be fixing it
- 3. Dan Russell has quote from a lock company. Working with IT on timeline for apartment-style buzzers for seniors
- d. Summer Camp Preview/Camp Guide Unveiled Thursday
 - i. 6-8 PM at C3
 - ii. Camp instructors will be in attendance
 - iii. Games will be played to entice engagement with instructors
 - iv. ADC will be at Roberts or Middle School; ADC2 is at C3
 - e. Summer activity guide will come out 4.20.18
 - i. Will include programs and activites from June Labor Day.
 - ii. Rooms downstairs will help with reconfiguring programming space and accommodating additional programming and demand for pickleball
 - iii. Tae Kwon Do Mon-Thurs 6-8:30 will relocate
- f. Passholder Update
 - i. 344 new members in 2018; Includes renewals and new members
 - ii. Total of 2,110 as of Jan 31st
 - iii. Lucille Roberts/Curves conversions New numbers will be e-mailed 2/21/18
- g. Website Update
 - i. Most info was migrated
 - ii. Allison from PMPIO and slowly updating to reflect current happenings, e.g. summer camps, rentals
- h. Sensitivity Training
 - i. 2/26, 2/27 6-7 PM at Township Building
 - ii. All full-time, part-time, citizen boards
 - iii. Seasonal employees will have dates in the near future
- 5. Board of Supervisors Liaison Report
 - a. Went 6 weeks without a meeting Early in January and late in February
 - b. Project program with foundation providing 10 family memberships has been approved.
 - i. The BOS does not/will not know who those families are
 - ii. Not sure at this time if any of those families have already started using C3
 - iii. High School social worker said there are more than enough families who could use this
 - iv. If families do not use, the program will be re-evaluated or those memberships may be reallocated
 - c. Eagles will be at the casino two weekends
 - d. Eagles proclaimation by Bridgeport Mayer was a nice gesture
- 6. Park and Recreation Advisory Board Liaison Report
 - a. 2 UMBA reps attended last meeting to formally request approval to demolish old press box
 - i. Will replace with 2x24 sturcture with kitchen and concsessison stand that they are funding

- ii. Township will be able to use it for camps
- b. Farmers Market Manager position appears to have been filled
- c. Emerald Ash Borer logging contractor approved to clear the disease-prone trees at Heuser park and surrounding parcels
 - i. Work will begin in March
 - ii. Wood will be sold
 - iii. Was difficult to find contractors
 - iv. Lucky to break even
- d. Pickelball
 - i. Rob received many comments that this is the nicest facility in the area
 - ii. Ordering new orange indoor balls
 - iii. Wednesday night after-work programming could enhance passholder memberships
 - iv. Average 32 players on Sundays
 - v. Several (at least 4-5) meetup members have joined. Friday evening and Sundays
 - vi. Saturday morning is also popular, but a whole different group
 - vii. Those who don't join come back and pay \$10
 - viii. GlennAnne had asked front desk to track who payed open gym fee for pickleball 9 paid through mid-January
 - ix. Since December, how many non-residents became members? Numbers not available, but can be provided
 - x. Highest trending sport with 3M players in 2018
- 7. Senior Center Representative Liaison Report
 - a. Terry requested update from President about BCA grant
 - i. Inquired after board meeting, as advised
 - ii. President was not willing to share with "layers of people"
 - iii. Someone had approached President and he sent a letter
 - iv. President is still being onboarded
 - v. Board meeting last was cancelled for weather They may not have met for 2 months.
 - vi. Under consideration no decision
 - 1. \$4K to subsizise quartlery bus trips
 - 2. declining sign ups attributed to cost
 - a. Daylin Leach had gotten grant and they all remember when the bus was free
 - 3. 1900 for 2 desktop computers for a new part-time emloyee and replacement for accountant
 - a. Still a lot of absences, illnesses; new employee is there to augment
 - b. Cross-training suggested to improve redundancy
 - 4. \$1600 for folding wall for great room to block sound when two activities are going on
 - a. A partition was procured but was not floor to ceiling
 - b. Original request by senior center was for petition, but was not granted

- vii. Senior Center has traditionally received BCA grant
 - 1. Must Report on how grant is used is required
 - 2. Random audits are conducted
- b. Parking still bad on Monday morning 40 play Mahjong and then 40 more do Zumba plus a discussion group 8-16 people
- c. Perception of C3 as non-welcoming
- d. A lot of newly retired people, but they are not coming in
 - i. New activities suggested to draw them in
 - ii. They got accustomed to only having activities at certain times to accomdoate school district and no longer have those time constraints
 - iii. Terry is going to conduct online survey, printed, mailed to see what demand is for new programming
- e. Garden club in dry season can water the patio
- f. Have to prop the door open because it will lock
 - i. Questioned why the door wouldn't work
 - ii. There is a key, but difficult to operate
 - iii. Propping door can lead to pets problems in kitchen

- a. Lower level visit
- b. Backlighting electrician is awaiting options and quotes and believes backlighting will work
- c. Branding and corporate memberships
 - i. Options for corporations bring them in as a group
 - ii. In conversation with School District (500-600 employees)
 - iii. Dentist office registered 7-8 passholders
 - iv. Individuals who work in township may also apply not sure of those numbers
 - v. Programming GroupX was revamped from Jan May based on feedback that previous times didn't work for corporate niche
 - 1. Offered early morning, mid-day, after work
 - vi. Corporate members come with 25% discount on pool
 - vii. Tells them if they have a special need or desire to have a corporate program, e.g. corporate dodgeball, it can be accommodated
 - viii. Is Casino a prospect? New management company has history of community involvement
- d. The upstairs heat
 - i. Use a large utility fan that is used for certain classes
 - ii. Get reversible fan that can be used for both seasons

- a. Resident, member of Lifetime, didn't know the C3 existed
 - i. Is there more that can be done, especially on the outskirts of the township.
- b. Charter members were offered 3 free months for renewing
 - i. Discussed new rolling membership policy, and is still going public
 - ii. A letter was written and it was passed to Dan
 - iii. Charter members will now also have rolling memberships, but they have to renew first

- c. What is passed to board for discussion
 - i. Decisions on what to present to advisory board are made on case-by-case basis
 - ii. Boundaries are fuzzy, which is good or bad
 - iii. Decisions are still made by the P&R department
 - iv. No votes are allowed outside of meeting
 - v. Board requests e-mail notification of ongoing business
 - vi. Do board members get hats?
- d. Multi-purpose court has blue spots.
 - i. Gerry T. is taking a look
 - ii. UMBA programs are leaving the marks
 - iii. It can be cleaned, but must use more than water
 - iv. Erasure shows damage to finish
 - v. Ask UMBA to clean the floors
- e. Coat/bag cubicles need cleaning/wiping
- f. No limite to capacity for center
 - i. Pool capacity is 2000 members
 - ii. Not all attend at the same time
- g. Footsall rented on a Sunday
 - i. There was a gym attendant.
 - ii. Started before closing, stayed for 3 hours
- h. Indoor nets when not used should be put aside
 - i. Gym attendants will be made aware
- i. Sundays for Pickelball, basketball nets go up first
- j. Complaints about court usage is byproduct of growing
 - i. Issue came up last year, too
 - ii. The season for indoor sports/training
 - iii. It's temporary, and no guarantees for gym availability
 - iv. Not different than waiting for tennis courts, playground
 - v. Time limits on open gym
 - vi. Will dictate sharing
 - vii. Volunteer coaches in township have time allocated; some opt to purchase additional time
- k. Spin room upgrading MyZone.
 - i. Working with them
 - ii. It is moving forward
 - iii. Additional monitor
- 1. Ability to advertise in activity guide
 - i. No outside ads in summer activity guide
 - ii. Reach out to Public Information Office Allison Pim Library, senior center have those opportunities
 - iii. Did not want to approach space
 - iv. Township Lines accepts some ads, but needs to be balanced with content
 - v. King of Prussia News started to accept more ads
- m. April or May Workshop with township BOS
 - i. Paul will send out the preliminary draft
 - ii. We will coordinate to present well
- n. Liheap info for PECO

- i. Link to website, given to Terry for senior center
- ii. Can receive grants from state/PECO. \$200-\$1000
- iii. Really for anyone who could use that support
- iv. Alison Pim will include in Friday newsletter
- o. Theme for Senior Center Fall Fling is volunteer
